WHAT DOES THE PROGRAM DO?

In 2020, the Louisiana Watershed Initiative's coordinating state agencies selected 20 projects to receive about \$213 million in federal funding. The projects were selected because they align with the missions of these agencies and the long-term resilience objectives of LWI. Specifically, the projects will reduce flood risk in communities throughout the state, store floodwaters in ways that enhance natural habitats and move people in flood-prone areas out of harm's way. As the granting agency of these funds, the Louisiana Office of Community Development vetted the projects to ensure they meet U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requirements and align with the state's \$1.2 billion Action Plan for Community Development Block Grant Mitigation funds.

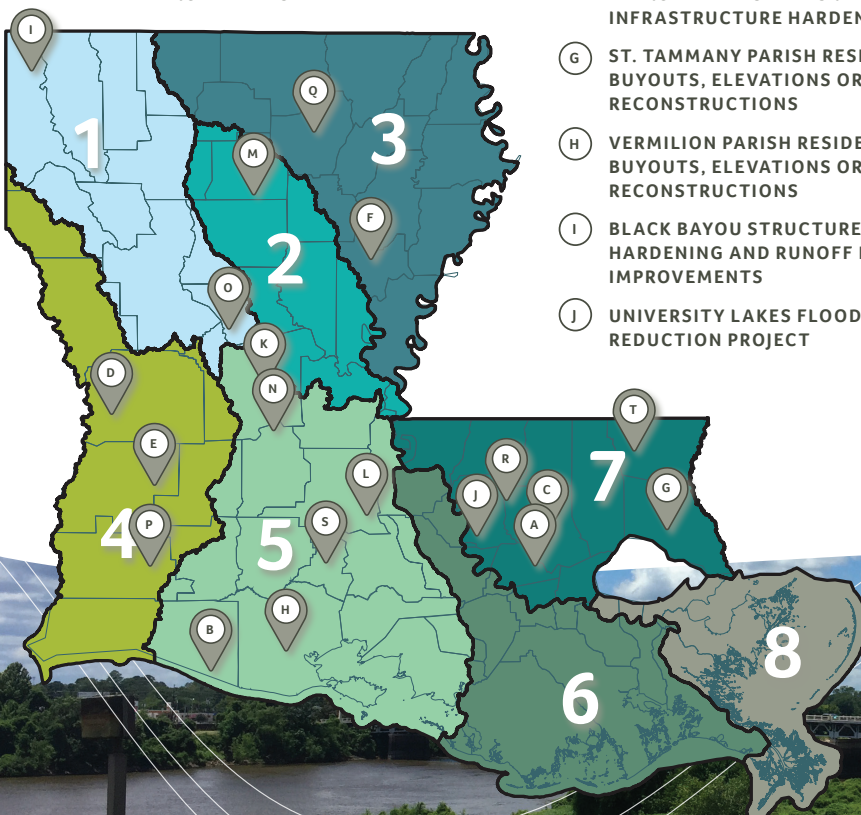

PROJECT TYPES

Project types include dam, flood control, drainage, critical infrastructure, nonstructural mitigation and capital improvements. All projects meet the following criteria:

- Reduce flood risk in a project benefit area or support analysis to optimize flood risk reduction for project in design stage
- Feature an eligible activity and advance a national objective
- Do not increase flood risk in surrounding areas
- Address project long-term operation and maintenance needs
